FRIENDLY REMINDER

If you live in TH Housing and leave town for any period of time, please notify the TH Housing Office. It is helpful to know the dates you will be absent, and who will be taking care of your unit (house-sitting, or monitoring your unit frequently).

Your rental unit is an asset of the TH Housing Program, and both landlord and tenant have a responsibility to protect it. If you keep Housing informed and your unit is monitored, both you and your unit are protected.

Situations we are trying to avoid:

- Boiler or furnace trouble that leads to pipes freezing and bursting
- Consequent water damage caused by pipes freezing and bursting
- Safety issues: if there is a natural disaster such as a fire or flood, Housing staff members work with first responders and we need to know who is in (or out of) the unit so other lives are not put in danger unnecessarily.
