The National Indian Brotherhood Trust Fund (NIB Trust Fund) is now accepting applications from *individuals* for education programs aimed at healing, reconciliation and knowledge building.

The deadline is June 2, 2017.

What you can apply for:

- **Scholarship** – University or College program
i.e. bachelor's or master's degree, nursing, law, aboriginal studies
- **Bursary** – Certificate or Training
i.e. trades, education training, adult education, professional courses
- **Award** – Traditional or Cultural Knowledge Building
i.e. language, ceremonies, healing, teaching

This walking tour – of historic buildings and two audio installations – acknowledges the impact of colonial heritage.

Many voices share reflections on past, present and future relationships between settlers, the First Peoples, and this land.

We will arrive at the town clock before 3 for bannock, tea and conversation.
